Professional Guidance for Contraceptive Implant

Context for this guidance:

The NHS Quality Improvement Scotland standards for sexual health services (1) states that women requiring contraception should 'have easy access to a range of contraception methods (including LARC) and are given the appropriate time and information to make informed decisions'.

Nurses and midwives require a level of knowledge and skills to safe guard and promote the interest of individual patients and clients (2). The Royal College of Nursing sets out guidance to establish principles for safe practice in the management and administration of medicines by registered nurses and midwives (3)

The original West of Scotland Sexual health MCN guidance was developed in 2006 to provide professional guidance to nurses and midwives who wished to acquire the knowledge and skills to undertake insertion and removal of the contraceptive implant but did not meet the training requirements previously set by the Royal College of Nursing eligibility criteria.

This guidance closely followed the training programme for medical and nursing staff developed by the Faculty of Sexual and Reproductive Healthcare (FSRH). It was revised and further developed in 2009 by Sandyford in consultation with senior nurses from the West of Scotland Sexual Health MCN (Ayrshire & Arran, Dumfries & Galloway, Forth Valley, Greater Glasgow & Clyde and Lanarkshire Health Boards) and updated in 2011, 2014 and 2017 by the West of Scotland Sexual Health MCN (5).

The original guidance pre-dated the development of the current FSRH Letter of competence in subdermal implant techniques (LoC SDI) (4). The FSRH qualification is nationally recognised and requires recertification every five years. All clinicians wishing to train in SDI techniques should be aware of this qualification and consider whether the FSRH qualification would be more suitable than a locally awarded certificate with no recertification element.


Purpose of this guidance:

Contraceptive implants are commonly used within the UK and this guidance refers to the training for insertion and removal of single rod contraceptive implants. It is designed for staff who will insert implants in general settings, for example within midwifery services, addictions services.

PLEASE NOTE: This guidance can ALSO be used for Insertion Only Competencies.

1. The term nurse within this document is defined as a registered practitioner on part 1 or part 2 of the NMC Register.

Pre-requisites to Access Training



Aims of training

Having completed training, the trainee will be able to:

- Appropriately consult with and assess women who wish to use sub dermal implants
- Describe the composition and pharmacokinetics of implants and potential drug interactions
- Demonstrate understanding of mode of action of local anaesthetic and possible side effects
- Explain the indications and contraindications, medical eligibility criteria, advantages and disadvantages, side effects and complications of SDI use
- Explain the evidence based information that should be given to women choosing SDIs, including local pathways back into care if they require it, for example if they have bleeding or other side effects
- Describe the mode of action and contraceptive efficacy of SDIs
- Demonstrate competence in insertion of SDIs in conscious women, to include the use of local anaesthesia
- Manage medical emergencies associated with insertion and removal
- Describe the management of an impalpable implant and referral local referral pathway

Contraceptive Implant Training consisting of 3 components

- 1. Theory
- 2. Model Arm Training
- 3. Clinical Training

Theory and model arm training must be complete before commencing clinical training. Practical sessions should be completed within twelve months of undertaking the theoretical training.

Specific documentation will be provided by the training centre including an activity log which should be completed by the trainee and signed off by the approved trainer.

1. Theoretical Training – completion of prerequisites of training (see flow chart above)

2. Model Arm Training

- Practice of technique of local anaesthetic administration
- Practice of techniques for subdermal insertion and removal of contraceptive implants
- Use of ethyl chloride spray if applicable

3. Clinical Training

Clinical sessions for practice should be arranged through area Specialist Sexual and Reproductive Health Services. The trainee will observe a minimum of one insertion and one removal. The trainee must perform a minimum of two consecutive competent insertions and removals on conscious women who have agreed to take part in the training session. Some professionals will require additional training until the trainer and trainee are satisfied competence is achieved. Specific documentation will be provided by the training centre including an activity log which should be completed by the trainee and signed off by the approved trainer.

Continuing Professional Development and Maintaining Competence

A reflective log should be kept on implant experience in practice. Nurses should undertake a minimum of 6 insertions and removals per year, depending on whether they are competent in insertions only.

The responsibility for this lies with the individual and their line manager/employer and not the trainer or training organisation.

Attendance at an annual contraceptive update, held locally by specialist sexual and reproductive health services, would be beneficial to ensure the professional is aware of current best practice.

This training document relates to contraceptive implants available at the time of writing. It is the trainee's responsibility to undertake the necessary training relating to any new devices introduced in future.

Trainers

Trainers should have recognised experience as a trainer e.g. FSRH Registered Trainer, University Educational Qualification or mentor on NMC register as per Faculty guidance. The trainer should be demonstrably competent in SDI insertion and removal.

Appendix A: Competence Record

During training the trainer must initial and date the column he/she feels adequately reflects the trainee's competency with regard to the insertion and removal of single rod contraceptive implants. On completion of training, Level A must be met in all areas of practice prior to being signed off as competent.
